A cruise is a great way to make the most of the festive season - or escape it entirely, says **Gabriella Le Breton**

hether you love Christmas and its trimmings, or would prefer to avoid it altogether, the cruise companies provide a huge choice of ships and facilities over the festive period. Destinations can be overtly Christmassy Europe's traditional Christmas markets, say – or beautifully wintery: spotting polar bears from a quiet, adult-only ship, for example. Below is my selection of the best seasonal cruises. Prices are per person, unless stated.

CLASSIC CHRISTMAS CRUISES

THE DANUBE Tauck's Christmas river cruises sell out every winter, thanks to the little touches the company is known for, such as exclusive tours and visits to markets not accessed by other cruise lines. There is limited availability on the seven-night Danube itinerary, departing Nuremberg on December 4 for Vienna on the MS Swiss Jewel.

Mundy Cruising (020 7292 2385; www.mundycruising.co.uk) offers the week-long Danube itinerary from £1,475, including flights.

NORWAY There can be few better places to celebrate Christmas than the Arctic, under the Northern Lights. Hurtigruten's MS Polarlys will sail north from Bergen in southern Norway to Tromsø in six days over the course of which passengers will be immersed in Norwegian traditions and can enjoy activities such as dog-sledding and snowmobiling.
Hurtigruten (0844 448 7601; www.

hurtigruten.co.uk) offers the six-night "Venture into the Arctic" voyage departing December 22 from £1,295, with flights.

THE BALTIC Indulge in last-minute Christmas shopping and soak up the festive atmosphere in Oslo, Copenhagen, Amsterdam and Bruges or Ghent. Sailing on P&O's mid-sized, adult-only Artemis, passengers can unwind before returning to celebrate Christmas at home.

The seven-night Baltic itinerary is available from P&O Cruises (0845 678 0014; www.pocruises.com) from £692, departing Southampton on December 14.

ANTARCTICA Snow, icebergs, polar bears, penguins - Antarctica is the perfect Christmas landscape, with none of the rampant consumerism. The fortnightlong Christmas cruise on the
